

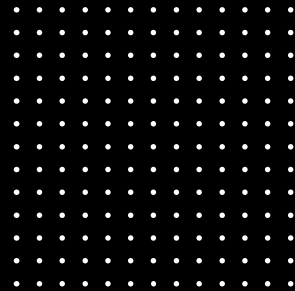

Apprenticeships



- Whether you're a student or employer, apprenticeships make sense.
- Joining the scheme means development, both for an individual and the organisation, as a person gains a nationally-recognised qualification while in employment.

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What is an Apprenticeship?

Being an Apprentice means that you have a full time job that includes training and working towards a recognised qualification



You will be employed and paid a wage whilst learning a wide range of skills specific to your chosen trade or career

Your employer will give you time to study. You will work with an assessor or tutor to gain the skills and knowledge to achieve a nationally recognised qualification. You may attend college to work towards your qualification or receive specialist training from an assessor in the workplace

How Lessons and Assessments work
