Eligibility Criteria

All applicants

- Can apply from 17.5 years old
- Can start employment from 18 years old
- Must be British Citizens, or passport holders from a full EU member state.
- You can also apply if you're a Commonwealth citizen or a foreign national who is resident in the UK with indefinite right to remain.
- Must have been a resident in the UK for the three years immediately preceding application
- Must hold a full manual driving licence when applying

Pathways into Policing – Overview

| 3 Year Probation | 2 Year Probation |
| 32 UCAS Points | A level qualifications. or At least one year work experience or studying with comparable skills to policing. or Work experience within Policing roles or armed forces |
| BSC Prof. Policing | Level 5 equivalent qualification |

- Starting salary for **both pathways** is £31,551 which includes £3,000 South East Allowance
- All officers are required to work shift patterns according to the department they are on. This
 will initially include weekends, bank holidays, earlies, lates and nights.



PCDA Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship

 Must hold GCSE Maths and English at a minimum of grade C or 4 (or equivalent qualification, such as level 2 functional skills in Maths and English) + 32 UCAS points

- Three-year programme which leads to a fully funded BSc (Hons) degree in Professional Policing with Anglia Ruskin University

PCEP Police Constable Entry Programme

 Must hold an A Level 3 qualification (2 A Level passes at Grade E) or above

or

An equivalent qualification or evidence of at least one year's employment/experience in a role with comparable skills to policing or academic study

or

PCSOs or Special confirmed as fit for independent patrol and those leaving Armed Forces

You will be invited to a virtual interview with 2 members of the force, this is to understand more about you and why you want to join. This will be between 7 - 14 days after passing OAC.

**Please note these timescales are just a guide and will change depending on individual circumstances

Training School

- Approx. 20 Weeks at Gosling Sports Park, WGC or Letchworth
- Monday to Friday 9-5 with 2 weeks annual leave as allocated
- Classroom and practical learning
 - Police powers and responsibilities
 - Vital policing skills such as statement writing to road closures
 - Crime definitions
 - Roleplays in training school and in public
- PST & PPE Handcuffs, batons, PAVA and more.
- Attestation Ceremony (Sworn in as Constable), uniform and equipment issued
