# Entry Requirements

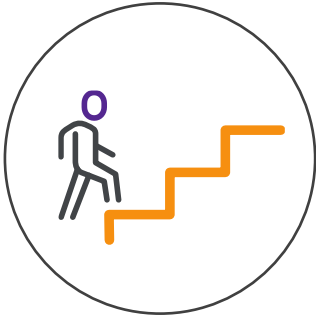


- Be 16 or over.
- Live in England.
- Not already be in full-time education.
- Some apprenticeships require certain qualifications, such as GCSE English or maths.
- Higher or degree apprenticeships may have additional academic requirements.
- Plumbing and Gas require a Level 2 Technical Certificate
- HR requires an Interview with awarding body organisation - CIPD

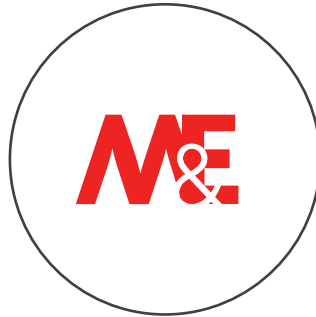




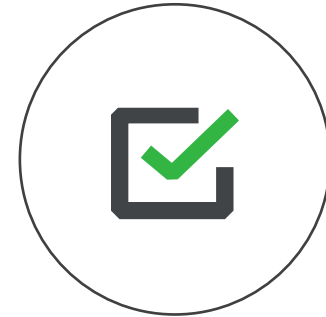

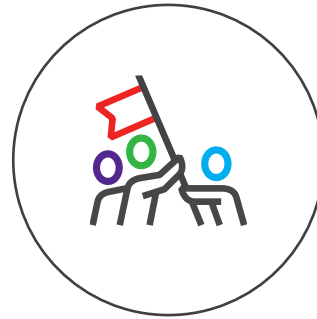

# What to do next?



Employers

- Think about local and National Employers you would like to work for
- Look on their Websites for “Early Career or Apprenticeship Opportunities – contact them to ask
- You need a Job offer to start an apprenticeship – we can help but ultimately it is down to the individuals.
- What do Employers expect? How do employers want apprentices to behave?



Create a CV

- **Stand out** - Your CV should demonstrate your unique blend of skills and experience.
- **Keep it simple** – Avoid strange fonts and bright colours.
- **Tailor your CV** – Tailor your CV towards the role you are applying for.
- **Double check** – Ensure there are no spelling mistakes or dates that clash.
- **Up-to-date** – Your CV should be fully up-to-date before you apply.
- **Silly mistakes** – Don’t list a phone number or email that doesn’t work / don’t use an unprofessional email address e.g. “[gamerdude@hotmail.com](mailto:gamerdude@hotmail.com)”



Interview Preparation

- Research the Company
- Understand what the apprentice role is all about
- Prepare your answers
- Practice your interview technique
- Dress Appropriately
- Prepare questions for the interviewer
- Plan out the practical details
- Stay calm and confident
