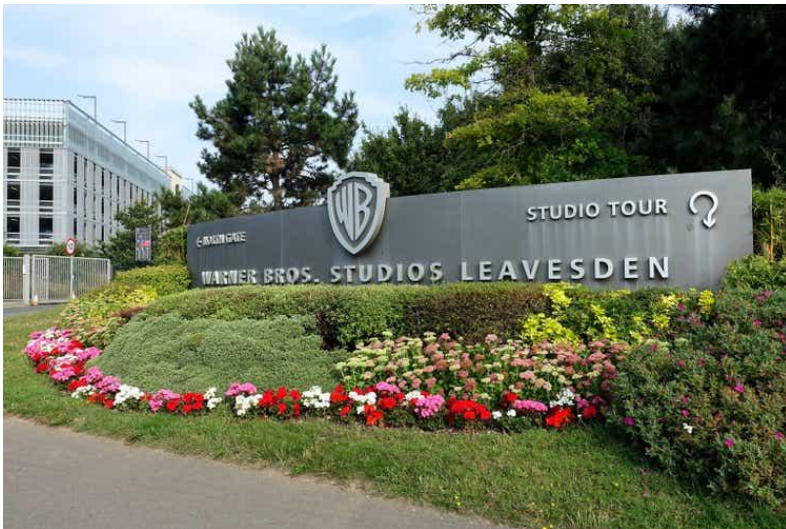

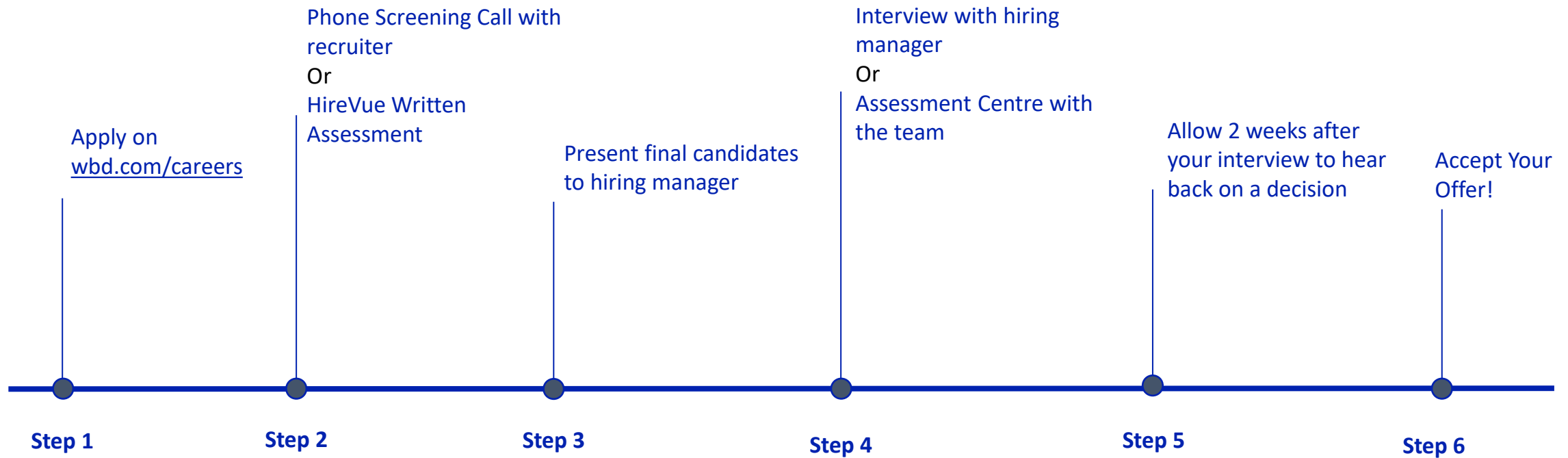

Insider Tips on CVs & Portfolios

How to make your CV stand out:

- Profile paragraph
- Use action words!
- Have a clear layout
- Make your CV intuitive (ie: if the job you're applying for requires great organisational skills, ensure that your CV is not disorganised).

If you need a cover letter:

- Describe why YOU are the best fit.
- Explain why THIS COMPANY.
- Wrap it up with a summary.

Reels & Portfolios:

- Quality design & creativity.
- Real work! School work is great, work you've done outside of education helps to show your passion for design.

How to leave a great first impression:

- Come to your interview prepared and having done all the proper research beforehand (*work tasks department, content, hiring team*).
- Prepare questions to ask at the end of your interview.
- Follow up with a thank-you note.

- Any advice on how to set yourself apart from other candidates? – Enthusiasm! A smile goes a long way 😊
- Are there opportunities to stay on after you've completed your apprenticeship? – Yes! Although you aren't guaranteed a role, we have seen many apprentices go into full-time positions at the company or progress onto a higher/degree apprenticeship.
- What tasks might you get in an assessment centre? – You may get a group task assessing your collaboration skills, a presenting task to assess your confidence, or an individual task to assess specific skills required for that role.
- Is there flexibility with the apprenticeship if you are busy at work? – Yes! If you're falling behind on work due to a busy schedule, there is lots of flexibility to catch up at a later date.
- How is the week structured when balancing apprenticeship work and work in my role? – You may be given a day a week to complete your work or you may want to spread your work out over a week e.g. 1 ½ hrs a day everyday or two half days.
